Experimental SPOON Cancels.

Duplex cancel known as a SPOON type of obliterator due to its shape.

This trial was to see how well the design was accepted; the Duplex showed the Town of origin, with the Day, Month, Year and a code letter in one part, and a second part contained an 1844 Town numeral issued to the Provincial Towns of England and Wales, this was in the centre of unframed three bars top and bottom, with two bowed bars at the left and right. This was trialled in 29 Towns from 1853 to 1870; the first Town to use this method was Hull on 21st December 1853.

There are many different varieties amounting to well over 280 items which would require at least eight frames or more and that is without Northern Ireland which includes 38 Towns from 1855 to 1872.

Some of these are shown here, beginning with Hull and continuing in alphabet order.

HULL was the first Town to trial this stamp mark, issued on 21 December 1853, earliest date used 24 December 1853. First part of duplex **HULL / DE 31 / 1853 / B** (code letter). Second part of duplex Bar 3 / 2 - 2 / 3 / 383 (1844 numeral).

Type A can be recognised by an oval frame joined to the Town numeral.




