

THE PARIS STAR CANCELLATION

1852 TO END MARCH 1876

The Paris Star cancellation can be found on:-

- 1849 first Ceres issue (beginning 1852)
- 1852 Presidency issue
- 1853-1870 Napoleon III Empire issues
- 1870- end March 1876 Siege and 3rd republic Ceres issues

Louis Napoleon Bonaparte was elected President of the new 2nd Republic in 1848. After further social upheaval, he had the backing to mount a successful coup d'état on 2 Dec 1851; many were attracted to the regime by the Bonaparte legend and the restoration of the Empire. Most important postally were the increasing volume of postal communication and the introduction of postage stamps on 1 Jan 1849.

On 1 Jan 1852, a circular about cancellations, issued by the Administration to all postmasters, instructed that the Paris Central Post Office (also known as Bureau J.J. Rousseau) would not have a number or a letter in a "lozenge", but would use an obliteration in the form of a six-pointed star of dots. This design was to last for nearly 25 years and was expanded to serve 39 other bureaux in the central Paris commercial district.



26-9-53?, grill cancellation, PARIS PL DE LA BOURSE SG1.

PD, on piece. The grille cancellation was used throughout France until superseded by the Δ numeral cancel, 1-1-1852. The grill was used later, in Paris, on local mail, as probably here. This usage is exceptionally rare on stamps of the first issue. 1.




6-7-53 (back stamp), full star in dots, no date stamp, Paris for Paris, To 303 Faubourg St Antoine.

As of 1 July 1853, the rate for prepaid letters was reduced from 15c to 10c (but unpaid letters charged 15c)

SG 2.

Also the 15c green stamp (SG 2.) was declared obsolete.² The cover above was processed and posted 5 days after this date.


