



Sanitarium provided a card album for young collectors to place their cards and stamps in. Below is one of the pages showing the Saltwater Crocodile and the common Hippopotamus

THE SALTWATER CROCODILE is the largest living reptile in the world. It can grow to a length of 7 metres or more, and it lives in estuaries, streams, swamps, lakes and coastal waters across Northern Australia. (Despite its name, it is also found in freshwater).

Saltwater Crocodiles feed on crustaceans, fish,

reptiles, birds and mammals. The prey is usually caught when it comes to the water to drink. Although attacks on people occasion-

ally make news-paper headlines, crocodiles are not

big eaters. They need only 10 per cent of the nourishment of a mammal of equivalent size.

THE WHITE RHINO, like other rhino species, is on the verge of extinction. It survives only in small 'pockets' of the African continent, mainly in

'Square-lipped' rhinoceros.

The heaviest bull rhino can weigh more than 3 tonnes

(3,000kg) and although



rhinos are bulky animals, their trot and gallop are very powerful. They can cope with very rough country, and their thick skin means they can push through dense and thorny vegetation like armoured cars!
